Gunn, one of two public high schools in Palo Alto, is a 4-year high school with an enrollment of just over 1900 students (**461 seniors**).

The ethnic/racial makeup of our student population is 2.1% African-American, 7.4% Hispanic, 34.9% Asian, 5.5% Asian Indian, 49.5% Caucasian, 0.2% other and 20 students declined to state. Roughly 4% of our students are classified as limited English proficient. Over 90% of each graduating class enrolls in institutions of higher education. All classes meet 240 minutes a week. Students are expected to carry a minimum of seven classes (seniors must take a minimum of five classes). The academic year is comprised of two semesters. The faculty includes a principal, three assistant principals, a dean of students, an athletic director, a part-time student activities director, a psychologist, six counselors, a full-time librarian, and a part-time library assistant. The majority of our teachers hold at least a master's degree. Gunn currently has seven teachers with National Board Certification and three teachers with Clinical Competence Certificates.

EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY

As a comprehensive high school, Gunn is committed to high standards, to the education of the whole child and to ensuring that all students meet their potential. We offer courses to meet a wide range of abilities and interests. Academically advanced students are encouraged to challenge themselves by taking honors and Advanced Placement courses. Gunn houses the District's high school English Language Learners Program. Students with limited English proficiency receive special services, such as instruction and assistance from primary language tutors and placement in sheltered English and Social Studies classes. The goal of the ELL program is to help students transition to mainstream classes as soon as possible.

Students with learning differences or physical disabilities receive support through a full range of services. Gunn has eight resource specialists, two special day classes and a program for orthopedically handicapped students. There are also specialists in teaching the hearing and visually impaired and a part-time speech and language specialist. Appropriate accommodations are made for students with special needs.

The AVID/FOS program provides support and encouragement to selected students deemed to have the potential to enter four-year colleges after high school. Focus on Success offers support to students through tutoring help, skill development and special encouragement to achieve their objectives.

Gunn also offers an Opportunity Program to freshmen and sophomores who feel that a comprehensive high school does not fit their needs, a Middle College option through Foothill College for juniors and seniors and an Independent Study program in a few classes for special circumstances.

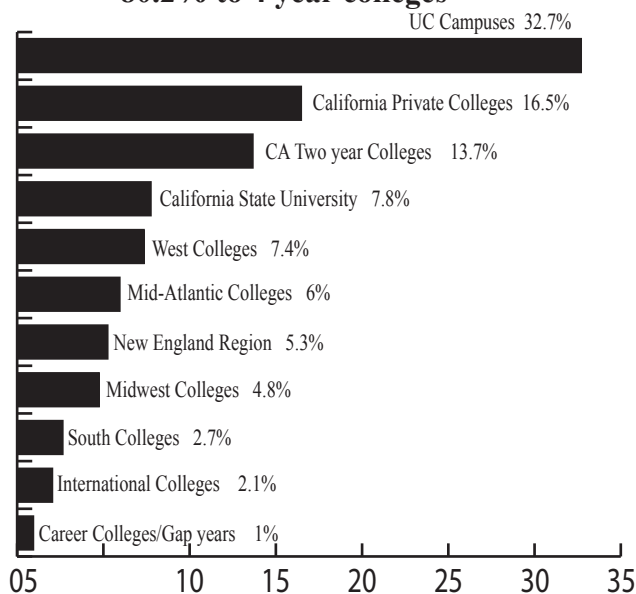
